Values and good behaviour.

At Whitchurch Primary School our values are simple, uncomplicated and clear. They are 7 words:

Respect, Excellence, Determination, Caring, Awareness, Friendship, Effort.

To our children these values are core to everything that happens, not just a poster on a wall. Assemblies, both in class and whole school, explains to the children what these values mean, and what they look like on a school, local and worldly scale. Rewards aplenty are given for showing them! Children receive certificates, stickers, raffle tickets and 'digital tokens for showing the values, and this not only makes children want to do their best, but also encourage others as the points contribute to 'House awards' meaning all children benefit from great behaviour!

Teaching and Learning.

Whitchurch Primary School was one of the first schools nationally to teach children using the 'Mastery system'. We thoroughly investigated and researched mastery, and through continuous professional development and training with our teachers and support staff it was quickly embedded throughout the school. Having been recognised as the best way to teach children across the country, we are proud to have led in this area.



Using our mastery system, we ensure each child's needs

are at the centre of our teaching. Using the very latest national curriculum, we plan our lessons with every child in mind. Lessons have elements to support those children who find the learning too challenging, and have elements to support those who do not find it challenging enough, ensuring every child has an opportunity to master their learning. At the end of the lesson children have an opportunity to assess themselves and their progress, before the teacher confirms this. This information sets up a number of 'next steps', including what happens in the next lesson, who attends our afternoon booster sessions, and who is given even more challenging work,

resulting in an upward spiral in which each and every child keeps learning more!

We are particularly proud that a number of local schools have visited us during our moderation sessions, where teachers from other schools have been given the opportunity to compare and contrast books of children's work. We have also led these sessions at other schools, improving education for children both inside the school and beyond!

Broad and Balanced curriculum

By far the most exciting and inspiring drive at our school this year is the introduction of our 'Broad curriculum, brought alive!' We declared our school vision of 'one thing a week', where each and every week we would carry out one sensational occurrence or happening for the children! From there teachers carried out individual 'Wow' lessons for their class alongside the 'one thing a week', increasing the superb educational opportunities for children at our school. Following this more opportunities arose to the point that there were a plethora of awe inspiring learning opportunities at our school. This year we plan to encapsulate this under the banner of 'Broad curriculum, brought alive' so that wherever and whenever possible our children's learning will not only be educational but exciting and inspiring!

School links.

Another source of immense pride amongst the children is the links we have beyond the school. On an annual basis, children take part in a series of community events in the local area where they see first hand how they can help others through their actions, and really make an impact on society.

On a weekly basis, children take advantage of the community around us with visits to a prestigious, state-of-the-art swimming facility, as well as training from professional coaches at the nationally renowned gymnastics centre. These wonderful opportunities have seen two of our pupils compete on the national stage in gymnastics!

Children also welcome in representatives from outside the school to work with them. Again, each week children can access cricket lessons from a former Pakistan player, football tuition from a former Manchester United squad member and art lessons from a renowned local artist!







Beyond the curriculum.

We aim to offer at least one extra curricula opportunity to the children every day, either at no cost or a very reasonable cost. At present we offer everything from 'Indo boarding', a circus style skill, to traditional netball led by our school's own teachers, with professional dance teachers and artists visiting us in between.

If you require 'wrap around' care at our school please take advantage of our breakfast club that begins at 7:45am. Here children can take part in a number of games and activities, with a healthy breakfast or snack for a reasonable payment. Beginning September 2022, we are excited to welcome PH Sports, who will be overseeing our new afterschool club, offering care until 5:45pm.

Our school meals are cooked on site, by our qualified team using locally sourced, fresh produce. All meals meet stringent healthy guidelines and are nutritious and delicious! Meals are free to all children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2.

Facilities and resources.

Investment in facilities and resources is key at Whitchurch Primary school! Our Victorian village school exterior contains the latest in touch screen LED interactive whitehoards, I-pads in every classroom (excluding a portable class set too) and a suite containing lap-tops, stop motion animation cameras and programmable Lego!

Since 2019 we have benefitted from our new school build, where children in Year 5 and 6 enjoy the transition from primary to secondary in 'state of the art' new classrooms, whilst 2020 saw the introduction of our new outside playground with swings and drums, alongside our forest school area to teach sustainability and an appreciation of the natural world. Last year we completed construction of our Reception area, a delightful outdoor play and learning space solely for the use of our youngest children!
