RSHE – An earlier newsletter gave you information on this term's 'Relationship, Sex and Health Education' curriculum (previously named 'Sex Education') at Whitchurch Primary School. As stated, below is a brief synopsis of what each class will be learning:

Reception: Labelling parts of our bodies.

Year 1/2: Lifecycles of frogs, butterflies and then humans (showing drawings of a baby in the womb, then as a baby, then a child, then an adult.)

Year 3: How our bodies change over time.

Year 4: How people become pregnant.

Year 5: Being aware of our image online. When is it appropriate to post photos, and how these can affect self-esteem

Year 6: I am aware of my own self-image and how my body image fits into that. I know how to develop my own self-esteem

YEAR 2 – Children in Year 2 will not receive universal free school meals from September when they move up to Year 3. Please ensure that you pay on Parentpay in advance, if you wish your child to have school dinners.
